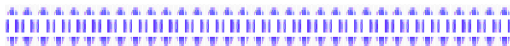

Presentation Methods

The Ethics & Confidentiality workshops will be a combination of PowerPoint aided lectures and in-class exercises provided by the presenters. Appropriate handouts will be included in both workshops.

The Infectious Disease workshop will be a combination of lectures and discussion and will include handouts with the latest resource information.

A review of both NAADAC & KAAP codes of ethics will be incorporated.

Ethics in Human Services 3 CEU's Tom Lohff

Participants in this three-hour workshop will gain an understanding of the importance of ethics in the ever-changing field of human services. Participants will receive information and tools to resolve ethical dilemmas. Participants will achieve an understanding of ethical conduct as it relates to the responsibility to clients, community and the field.

Infectious Diseases 2 CEU's Steve Randall

This training provides basic education and prevention regarding infectious diseases. The overall goal is to help participants identify ways in which chronic conditions such as HIV, TB, and HCV impact individuals struggling with addictions and the implications for counseling and care delivery. Participants will increase their knowledge of risk factors associated with these diseases and explore their attitudes and beliefs and how this impacts their work.

Confidentiality 2 CEU's Tom Lohff

This workshop will review federal and state regulations, laws and statutes regarding the confidentiality of substance abuse client records. Participants will increase their understanding of the guidelines and limitations for releasing information and will have a practical approach to address counselor concerns.

Tom Lohff, NCAC I, CADC III

Tom Lohff has worked in the addictions field since 1996 and is certified by the State of a Kansas as an Alcohol and Other Drug counselor and KAAP certification as a CADC III. For the past eight years Tom has worked for the Addiction Recovery Center (ARC) where he currently serves as the Program Director. He is an instructor for the addictions courses at Pittsburg State University including courses in Ethics, Addiction Awareness, Pharmacology of Addictions and Medical Issues in Substance Abuse.

Steve Randall is a certified Physician Assistant at the University of Kansas School of Medicine – Wichita Midtown Clinic, where he works in conjunction with Donna Sweet, MD. Steve has extensive experience working with patients living with HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis, and other co-infections. He is also an experienced HIV educator for the Kansas AIDS Education and Training Center.
